Year 2 Curriculum Newsletter - Term 2

We are excited to share our second Topic Newsletter of the school year. In **Term 2**, our topic title is still **'Pudding to Pepys'**

'This project teaches has a Geographical focus. It will build upon the children's knowledge of the four countries that make up the UK and focus in more detail on London and Eastbourne. The children will think about the differences between a city and town. They will use world maps, atlases, globes, aerial photos, information and other sources to find out about the human and physical features.

During this topic, your child will attempt to answer the essential question;

What are the main differences between our capital city and the town we live in?'

Topic Project

For each topic, we will ask your child to complete a home-learning project. We ask that every child has a go at completing a project that can be brought into school. For this topic, your child could make a map of the UK (highlighting London and Eastbourne), a more detailed map of London (including mini landmarks – River Thames, key buildings...) or a map of Eastbourne (including the sea, lighthouse, harbour, the Downs...).
