

      
Edith Cavell was a nurse in World War One.

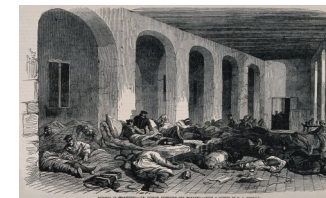
