



Remote Learning Expectations

Expectations of School Staff

As a school, we will:

- Provide a minimum of 3 hours of daily remote-learning lessons to all pupils in Reception and Key Stage 1.
- Provide a minimum of 4 hours of daily remote-learning lessons to all pupils in Key Stage 2.
- Provide access to online and remote learning and have paper-based copies of home learning available, when these are requested.
- Devise a clear timetable, with links to pre-recorded communication and videos / modelling / and key messages from teachers in your child's year group.
- Provide daily Maths and English lessons (this includes Phonics, Reading, Writing and Spelling).
- Offer daily subjects / projects to ensure a broad and balanced, and challenging curriculum, across all curriculum areas, such as Geography, Art, Music and PE, and suggestions for brain-breaks and play-based learning, if appropriate.
- Use 'Oak National Academy' and Purple Mash to support our pupils' online learning.
- Be available to answer queries and questions, via email, between 9.00am and 3.15pm, every day. (If you email us after 3.15pm, we will respond the next day).
- Provide feedback to all Maths and English learning, submitted by pupils.
- Ensure pupils receive clear explanations to their tasks.
- Review pupils' work when this is submitted.
- Support growth in confidence with new material, through scaffolded practice.
- Encourage application of new knowledge or skills.
- Provide daily and weekly quizzes, so that we can assess the progress that pupils are making.
- Host lessons, daily, via Microsoft Sway.
- Provide access to live content and interactions with teachers, through E-lecta. (further details after half term)
- Provide access to a free online library, through our myON platform. (further details after half term)
- Support pupils with additional needs, by carefully considering the learning opportunities available to them.

Expectations of Pupils

We expect all of our pupils to:

- Engage with the learning set by their teachers.
- Try their best at all tasks.
- Submit a piece of English and Maths learning, from each day.
- Take part in the quizzes.
- Join live online lessons, hosted by their teacher.

Expectations of Parents

We expect our parents to:

- Where possible, establish good learning routines with their child.
- Support their child as best as they can with home learning.
- Support their child's engagement with home learning, by submitting English and Maths learning, so that feedback can be provided by the child's class teacher.
- Be available for a weekly welfare telephone call with their child's class teacher.
- Contact their child's class teacher if they have any issues or questions about the remote learning.
- Contact the school if there are any ongoing barriers to remote learning.
