The Hive



We are so proud of our inclusive practice at Oakwood.

Children love sensory circuits as it helps them to feel happy when they come into school and calm, ready to go to class for learning.

Our small group intervention sessions have helped children learn about feelings and things that make us happy and sad.

In cooking this half-term, children have enjoyed making different recipes including: fruit salad, crumble, rock cakes and chicken pasta salad. We have learnt a variety of cooking skills – hygiene, knife safety, reading instructions and measuring ingredients.

P.E

We are so lucky to have a specialist PE teacher - Miss Stew - who works across all year groups to deliver fun and active PE lessons!

In Early Years this term, the children have been developing their movement skills by exploring how to change direction safely and with control. They have enjoyed playing games that help them build balance, coordination, and spatial awareness while moving in different ways.

Across KS1, the children in KS1 have been learning the skills needed for invasion games, focusing on passing, communicating, and teamwork. They have enjoyed working together to move into space, share ideas, and understand how to play effectively as part of a team.

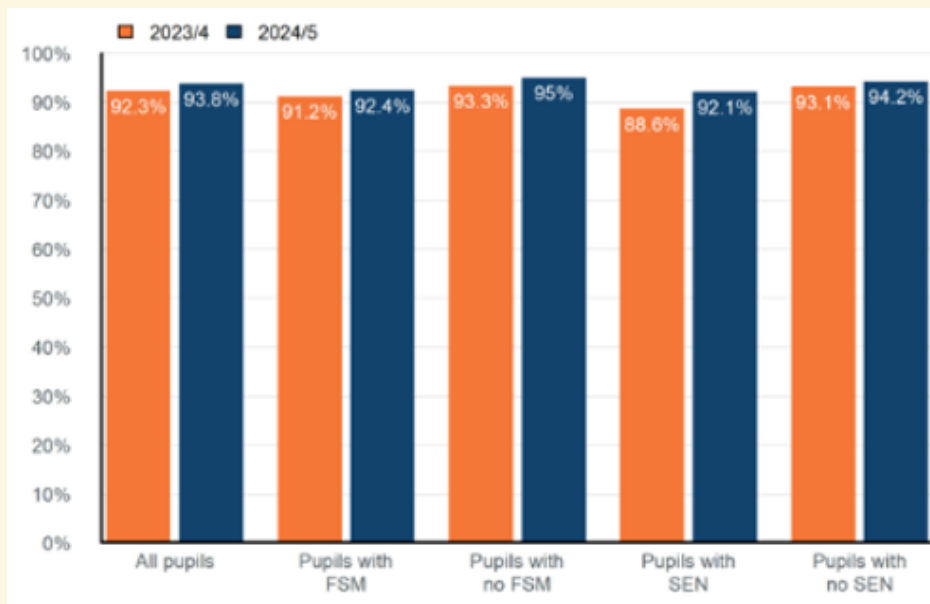
And in KS2, the children in KS2 have been developing their ball skills, focusing on control, accuracy, and coordination. They have enjoyed practising a range of techniques to improve their passing, catching, and shooting, as well as applying these skills in small games and team challenges.



Pupil Performance Outcomes

We are extremely pleased to say that attendance is on the up and it's our continued mission this year to maintain our upward trajectory. Essentially, we know that children who are in school more, make the most of school opportunities and reach better outcomes! We want the best for all our pupils and we know that 'each day counts'.

Take a look at our attendance comparison between 2023-24 and 2024-25 below!



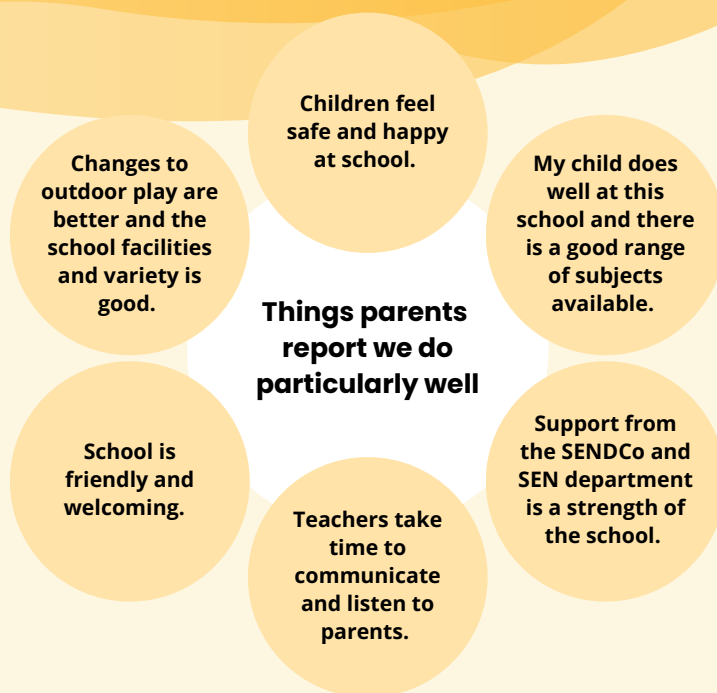

We're also so proud of our year six SATs results. We know that KS2 SATs are a reflection of a child's journey through school and we're pleased to share that we can now see a positive three year trend for our combined outcomes, where children reach age related expectation in all three subject areas. What's really cool about this, is that this percentage puts us in the 50th centile of similar schools – it's our target to reach the 25th centile soon! We can't wait to keep working on our curriculum offer, teaching and learning skills and targeted interventions in school to continue supporting our pupils in reaching ever new heights!

Parent Survey

A huge thank you to all parents who took time to share their views on our school, at the end of the Summer term. These have informed our school improvement priorities and plans for the coming year and we continue to strive to address the key areas you wanted to see improved.

I wanted to remind you of the things that you said Oakwood does well, as well as actions that we've undertaken in term 1, towards our development areas.



You said, we will



67% of our parents did not know who the Local Academy Board members are, what they do and how to contact them.

On Thursday 9th October, we held our first LAB meeting of the year, where all current LAB members met with Mrs Morgan to discuss the school priorities for the coming year. We agreed that parents would benefit from seeing LAB members at key events and Kimi Westgate (our co-opted governor) attended one of our parents' evenings to say hello to everyone!

We're also thrilled to have received four applications from parents wishing to join our LAB team. Keep your eyes peeled for key information about the election process herein! Moving forward, we'll continue to keep you posted about LAB news and would also like to share photos of our LAB members with you to help you put names to faces later in the year!



School dinners could be improved, including portion sizes and inclusive dinners for different diets.

We are continuing to work alongside Aspens – our catering company – to feedback our parents and children's view, working with them to refine the menu and portion size expectations. We've had some success with Jacket Potato and Pasta portion sizes and have seen improvements in the salad bar variety too. We continue to share the menu link on our weekly bulletin to support families to look ahead at what is available for lunch each day.



You said, we will



You'd like to see an improved offer of wrap around care, to support working families, requesting that breakfast club starts at 07:45 and after-school club provision is affordable.

Our breakfast club now runs 07:45 – 08:30am and we've received great feedback from several parents about how this is supporting their work commitments. We continue to work with East Sussex's grant scheme to strengthen our breakfast club and afterschool club offer for our families and we're looking at how we can offer clubs that reflect what our pupils are asking for. Waffle Wednesdays have been running across term one and have been very much enjoyed! We've introduced a new diet of clubs for term two, to keep things fresh.

We know just how much our children love cooking and forest school clubs and we're excited to see how 'nerf' and 'game show' club go down this term too!



School could improve how they deal with bullying, including putting in place suitable consequences.

We have a robust anti-bullying policy and investigation proforma, which is used to investigate and follow-up any allegations of bullying. As a school, we feel that this process isn't necessarily known widely by our children or parents, and previously, much of this has simply been carried out 'behind the scenes'. In term two, we'll look to share our bullying investigation protocols with parents and children, as well as establishing the difference between unkindness (one-off or un-targeted comment or action) versus bullying (repeated, intentional behaviour) during Anti-bullying week (W/C 10th November). We'll be inviting parents and senior leaders to a coffee afternoon (Tues 11th Nov 2-3pm) to discuss behaviour policy reforms and anti-bullying protocols. We're going to talk through what this looks like in practice and, most importantly, give space for parent feedback and suggestions too.

School should have fair rules and improve behaviour expectations to enable all children to be successful in the classroom, on a daily basis. You wanted us to better manage poor behaviour from key children, maintain calm and purposeful learning environments and establish equal treatment for everyone.

As a school, we have recently refreshed our behaviour policy for 2025-26. This now includes a set of clear and concise school rules and expectations: Be ready, respectful, safe. Year two have even made a school song to go alongside our rules!

Across term one, all classes undertook sessions and weekly class behaviour meetings in line with our trust-wide behaviour curriculum.

Themes included: values, responsibility, managing disagreements, pro-social behaviours and executive functioning skills. These themes have been led by the introduction of behaviour texts for each year group. We're so proud of the artwork that each class produced to go alongside this work, which now sit in our infant hall.

For children who are always displaying positive behaviours, we've introduced our 'Golden Tickets', and senior leaders have been loving seeing pupils for 'positives' on a Friday afternoon in our office!

In term two, we're launching Class Dojo Behaviour Points, to recognise pupils going 'above and beyond'! If parents connect via the Class Dojo app, you will receive alerts to let you know when your child has received a positive point.



You said, we will



Our uniform policy needs updating to incorporate girls being able to wear shorts.

Absolutely! Our uniform policy has now been updated to include knee-length black/ grey knee-length shorts!

As we head into term 2, we're going to continue our mission to drive our school sense of belonging, and one way we achieve this is by setting universal uniform standards. Please help us by ensuring that children wear correct school uniform, especially on PE days where 'plain, black' tracksuits are suitable, but logoed or other colour tracksuits are not!



Please could we have the newsletters out every Friday as it's nice knowing what's going on for the week ahead and the school dinners.

*Term 1 launched our Oakwood Branch, weekly bulletin and most weeks, I've been able to get this out on a Friday. Busy weeks do occasionally take over and I apologise when this is the case.

I will always endeavour to have this sent to parents as soon as possible, ready for the coming week!

Uniform Information

At Oakwood Primary Academy, we expect all our pupils to wear the correct uniform. It brings a sense of pride and purpose, helping us to work towards our shared values and collective identity.

School Uniform – Boys

- ❖ School jumper or cardigan, with the Oakwood logo,
- ❖ Plain white polo shirt or plain white cotton shirt,
- ❖ Black or grey shorts or long trousers,
- ❖ Enclosed black shoes (please avoid lace-up shoes until your child has learned how to tie laces, no sandals or leisure shoes).



School Uniform - Girls

- ❖ School jumper or cardigan, with the Oakwood logo,
- ❖ Plain white polo shirt or plain white cotton blouse/shirt,
- ❖ Black or grey skirt, pinafore dress, trousers or knee-length shorts
- ❖ Summer cotton dress in yellow and white stripe or check
- ❖ White socks or tights in black, white or grey,
- ❖ Enclosed black shoes (please avoid lace-up shoes until your child has learned how to tie laces, no sandals or leisure shoes).



PE Kit

- ❖ School yellow polo shirt, with or without Oakwood logo
- ❖ Plain black jogging bottoms, leggings or shorts (appropriate length)
- ❖ Black plimsolls or trainers.



All school uniform, PE kit and personal belongings, such as lunch-boxes, water bottles, coats and book-bags, should be clearly marked with your child's name.

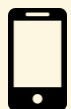
